If you see Officer Kintzi out on the streets please feel free to thank him for his service. The Osseo Police Department is excited to have such a dedicated officer on our team!




From your Chief

Crime Prevention Tips

Every year thousands of children are affected by violent crime. It is our job—our duty to keep our kids safe. Here are some tips and safety precautions every child should know.

- Help your child learn their full name, phone number, and address.
- Teach your child how to call 911.
- Teach your child how to identify “safe” adults, like a police officer or security guard or teacher.
- Explain to your child why they should never accept a ride, food, or gifts from someone they don’t know.
- Designate a safe spot in your neighborhood, like a trusted friend’s house, to go to in case of emergency.

City Ordinances/Code Enforcement

- No vehicle shall be parked upon any street or highway in the city for more than 24 hours.
- No vehicle shall be parked at any time within any part of the right-of-way of any alley in the city.
- No vehicle shall be parked, stopped or standing adjacent to any curb which is painted yellow.
- No person shall park a vehicle upon a street, highway or roadway for the principal purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale; or washing, greasing, or repairing the vehicle, except for repairs necessitated by an emergency.

Traffic Tips

When you are behind the wheel of a car—whether alone or with passengers—driving safely should always be your top concern. Drivers are more distracted than ever, so it’s crucial to know the basics of safe driving and practice them every time you’re on the road. Here are some safe driving tips:

- Keep 100% of your attention on driving at all times—no multi-tasking.
- Don’t use your phone or any other electronic device while driving.
- Slow down. Speeding gives you less time to react and increases the severity of an accident.
- Be aware of what other drivers around you are doing, and expect the unexpected.
- Keep a 2 second cushion between you and the car in front of you.
- Adjust your seat, mirrors, and climate controls before putting the car in gear.
- Avoid driving when you’re tired.
- Always wear your seat belt and drive sober and drug-free

What's Happening in your neighborhood?

Arrests:

A 42-year old Minneapolis man was arrested for driving after cancellation; inimical to public safety. He was transported and booked at Hennepin County Jail.

A 33-year old Saint Louis Park man was arrested for driving after cancellation; inimical to public safety. He was transported and booked at Hennepin County Jail.

An 18-year old Crystal woman was arrested for driving with a suspended driver's license. She was released with a citation.

A 19-year old Maple Grove man was arrested for driving with a revoked driver's license. He was released with a citation.

A 45-year old Blaine man was arrested for two felony narcotic warrants, obstructing the legal process, and giving false information to a peace officer. He was transported and booked at Hennepin County Jail.

Incidents:

Officers were dispatched to the 600-block of 6th Avenue NE for a report of a domestic in progress. The reporting party could hear yelling coming from the apartment. Officers made contact with the male and female occupants of the apartment. The male explained that he was the one yelling and screaming. He stated that while laying in bed their pet cat relentlessly started biting and scratching his foot. The officers did examine the male's foot and observed fresh injuries consistent with a cat attack. There was no evidence a domestic assault occurred.

An officer was dispatched to the 500-block of 3rd Avenue NE for a domestic dispute. A couple had just broken off their relationship and were arguing. Officers mediated the situation and the couple voluntarily separated for the night. No assault took place. There are no criminal charges.

Officers were dispatched to an assault report at the 200-block of 4th Avenue SE. A physical fight broke out after a group of patrons began arguing. Officers identified all parties involved. One suspect is being charged with disorderly conduct.

Accidents:

An officer was dispatched to the intersection of 1st Avenue NW and 5th Street NW for a two-vehicle property damage accident. The officer managed the crash scene and facilitated the exchange of information.
