My family and I are excited about this opportunity to be a part of the community. Thank you.




From your Chief

The Osseo Police Department does not have someone at the police department monitoring the calls 24 hours a day.

If you leave a message it may not get answered for a couple of days. I want everyone to get their questions answered and problem solved as quick as possible, so please if you want to report a crime or speak to an officers dial 911.

Crime Prevention

In order to protect yourself and your belongings from home break-ins, the Osseo Police encourage you to take these steps:

- Always lock your doors and windows. Inspect your doors and windows to make sure they are made from strong materials.
- Leave a light on when you go away, even for the evening. If possible leave a television or radio on as well.
- Be vigilant. If you suspect suspicious activity around your home, your neighbors homes, or in your area, please report it to the police immediately by calling 911.
- Request vacation checks. If you are planning to go out of town for any reason, be sure to call the Osseo Police Department and request a house check. While you are gone, Osseo Officers will preform extra patrols of your home, as well as checking the doors and windows to ensure they are secure. This service is free to all Osseo residents.

City Ordinances/Code Enforcement

The City of Osseo uses the uniform Hennepin County curfew ordinance. This ordinance has been adopted by cities in Hennepin County. The hours of curfew in the City are as follows:

- Under Age 12 home by 9:00 P.M. weekdays and 10:00 P.M. Friday and Saturday
- Ages 12-14 home by 10:00 P.M. weekdays and 11: 00 P.M. Friday and Saturday
- Ages 15-17 home by 11:00 P.M. weekdays and 12:00 A.M. Friday and Saturday

There are exceptions to the ordinance such as youth returning home from work or a school activity, running an errand for a parent, or in an emergency situation . If you have any questions, please contact the Osseo Police at 763-424-5444.

Traffic Tips

Drivers face many distractions behind the wheel. Please review these tips to stop distracted driving:

- Cellphones—turn off cell phones, or place them out of reach.
- Music and other controls—pre program favorite radio stations for easy access, adjust mirror and heat/AC before traveling.
- Navigation—designate a passenger to serve as a co-pilot to help with directions.
- Eating and drinking—try to avoid food/beverage, at least messy foods, and be sure food and drinks are secured.
- Children—teach children the importance of good behavior in a vehicle; do not underestimate how distracting it can be to tend to children while driving.
